

2019-20 ACHIEVEMENTS

REPEAL OF NCIP

AAFC instigated the removal of the NCIP by taking up the case of two clubs directly impacted by it. We also worked closely with FFA to develop the new policy.

NPL REVIEW

Membership of NPL Review Committee chaired by FFA and helping develop scope and process for review before COVID-19 related suspension.

NATIONAL SECOND DIVISION

Contributed significantly to NSD steering committee chaired by FFA Board member Remo Nogarotto. serving on two sub-committees. attending all meetings, developing options, liaising with stakeholders. conducting a workshop for clubs, drafting FFA Board resolution for adoption of White Paper, regular meetings with Nogarotto, FFA CEO James Johnson and John Didulica (formerly) of PFA.

XI PRINCIPLES

Provided extensive written response to FFA's XI Principles documents. followed-up by consultation and meeting with PFA.



REPRESENTATION

Represent issues for AAFC member clubs on specific club matters within their state member federation.

WORKING WITH STAKEHOLDERS

Working with FFA, state member federations and NPL clubs around football family including important Australia in relation to suspension and, in some instances, resumption of competition as a result of COVID-19



Football Federation Australia is set to take its national second-division blueprint to the market to gauge the interest and financial capability of clubs outside the A-League - and chief executive James Johnson believes it should be 'full steam ahead' if the response is strong enough.

It has been three months since FFA's steering committee for the ambitious project, led by board member and former National Soccer League boss Remo Nogarotto, was due to release firmer details on how the proposed second tier - a necessary precursor to A-League promotion and relegation - can get off the ground.





Competition (working model)

- Men's and Women's competitions
- One national league commencing with 14-16 teams
- Men's full home/away rounds and finals series
- Women's possibly commence with limited season
- Timing aligned with A-L/WPL possibly winter

Player roster

- 23 players on registered semi professional contracts
- Supporting playing time for younger Australian players
- No salary cap no minimum

Youth development

- Star rated academies NPL and SAP programmes
- Licensed coaches

Facilities

- 2,000+ capacity
- Meeting key FFA Cup broadcast match standards

Pro/Rel/Expansion

- Immediate to/from NPL no new silo
- Potential for A-L/WPL expansion build case for pro/rel

Corporate Governance


- High standards meeting Sport Australia guidelines
- Compliant with statutory requirements

- * Summer v Winter season
- * Governance/administration of the league


